NEWTON HILLS CAMP USAGE

1. Reservations must be made in advance at the Center for Scouting located at 800 N. West Ave. in Sioux Falls. Phone 605-361-2697
2. **Speed limit in camp is 10 m.p.h.**
3. Vehicles are restricted to **graveled roads and parking areas**, unless approval is given by the Ranger.
4. Keep vehicle traffic to an **absolute minimum**.
5. Upon arrival at camp, units must check in with Camp Ranger before setting up camp. If Ranger is unavailable, units must use self check in procedures at Ranger's residence in vestibule.
6. Campsite / building shall be left cleaner than upon arrival.
7. Units shall bring their own plastic garbage bags for their garbage. And shall take all garbage bags inside the garbage shed.
8. All plastic containers, aluminum and tin cans shall be rinsed out, crushed or flattened, and placed in separate bag from garbage, for recycling. Bag with plastic, tin, and aluminum shall be dumped out in clear recycling bag in blue recycle bin in garbage shed. Do NOT leave in separate garbage bag.
9. All damage to camp property, including carvings, writings, and burnings, shall be replaced or repaired by the individual or unit responsible, back to the original condition.
10. Fires shall be in established fire rings only.
11. No garbage, food, bottles, firewood, or refuse of any kind are to be disposed of in the latrines.
12. Firewood in the wood shelters is **for use inside the buildings only**, not for use in campsites.
13. Absolutely no standing (dead or live) trees will be cut for any reason.
14. To prevent problems with mice, all firewood that is taken into the buildings and not burned, shall be taken back to the wood shelter before leaving.
15. Campsite / building will be inspected by the Ranger after the unit leaves. His report will be sent to the Center for Scouting.
16. Practice **Leave No Trace**. Please take apart any shelters made and scatter sticks. This applies to the entire camp not just the activity areas. Please make sure all sticks used for projects are returned back to the woods.
